Dear Rosensohn:

I don't like the form in which the Tennessee motion to quash (which amounts, I suppose, to a demurrer) raises federal questions. I presume that on the new indictment which Neal said was promised the motion will be renewed in fuller and more artistic form drafted by you.

On reflection, I stayed away from the Tuesday afternoon meeting at your office, knowing that if I went I'd be sure to let myself in for work which, under my agreement with the American Fund, I have no right to undertake. I'm satisfied that the job of preparation couldn't be in better hands than yours (with or without the assistance of Dudley Malone's law clerks!). If pressure of time puts you in a serious hole, ask the American Fund for Public Service (through Roger Baldwin if he's in town) if they'll lend me to you for a few days. But I'd rather not interrupt my injunction job unless you seriously need me.
